This bike has featured in many publications and carries all the features associated with early CB750s such as the slash-cut front mudguard, early switch gear, ducktail seat, wrinkle fuel tank, early type No. 28 carburettor caps, 'nutted' mirrors, coloured air-filter housing etc. The blue/green paint is all original Honda finish.

The CB750 changed motorcycling forever, but Honda began changing and improving the CB750 almost as soon as it entered production to the extent that stood alongside a seemingly very similar model from the mid-1970s very little will be unchanged.
